## And a final word from Peter:

I don't believe God created the universe. The thought that God was there at the universe's beginning, so many billions of years before human history, raises too many problems for me. So traditional beliefs like "God is the creator" and references to "Nature being created by God" are not for me.

Rather, I find myself more comfortable with thinking that Religion, like Art, Music, Science and Technology, is one of the needed unnecessary great inventions of Thinking Humans. As the invention of religion became significant for humanities existence, the idea of "God or Gods", as both beyond us, but also present with us, has been introduced in culture after culture in many different ways.

For me, the essence of being human is twofold –the relationships we have with other humans and with the rest of the natural world on which we depend. This essence is shared so that, I believe, all humans have the individual and corporate, creative abilities to initiate actions that enrich these relations.

My meaning for the word "God" is this essential source of my creative ability to be socially and environmentally human. Personally, I identify with the term "Spirit" (the Christian idea of "Holy Spirit") rather than "God", to describe a source I regularly experience of sudden inspirations for extending relationships. The presence of this Spirit as a potentially available energy in every other human being, thus makes possible an ever-expanding set of richer outgoing and incoming relationships. Good human relationships also require respectful and quality relations with the natural order other living things and of the biosphere we all share.


Since my heritage and nurturing has been essentially Christian, a most powerful model for rich relationships between humans and the "Spirit quote has come from what is known of the life of Jesus of Nazareth and from many others I have known or learnt about who have based their lives on his example.

Furthermore, Christine and I have also, for most of our lives, been fortunate to be part of Christian communities that are open about beliefs, concerned about social justice, and provided a warmth of caring relationships.

Because I believe relationships, not individuals or atoms, are the basis of being, my goal in life has been to strive to become more human: more loving, more compassionate, more courageous, more just, more environmentally responsible, more happy, more caring, more peace seeking, and more wise.
