

FINAL COMMENDATION

Invitation to Prayer

We gather around the body of Elaine, all that is left to us of her, to pay our last respects. Keeping our eyes fixed on the cross of Jesus Christ, we say in a searching faith that this is not the end but that our God is a God of the living. Rather than his body we are left with the name, Elaine, which we now speak with reverence and affection.

And so we pray:

Lord God, remember this name which she was given by other people and by which she is known even though she is now dead, a name that you have written on the palm of your hand. We thank you, God, for Elaine, who was so near and dear to us and who has now been taken from us. We thank you that even in the times of suffering she became a person who could love and she was a person others could love while she was with us here on earth.

We pray that nothing of her life will be lost, but that it will be of benefit to the world; that all she held sacred may be respected by those who knew her, and that everything in which she was great may continue to mean much to us now that she has died. We ask you that she may go on living in her family, and her friends, in their hearts and minds, their courage and their conscience.

We ask you, that we who were associated with her may now, because of her death, be even more closely associated with each other, and that we may, in this togetherness and peace and friendship here on earth be always deeply conscious of your promise to be true to us in death.

We ask you that Elaine, now living with you, will watch over us, and will intercede for us, that she may remind you unceasingly of our names as Jesus does, a person near you in eternity. As a sure sign of our hope that God will give a new and immortal body to Elaine and to all of us, and to bear witness to our faith in the resurrection, I bless her body with this Baptismal water, in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
